She completed and received a certificate from the Apex Beauty & Barber School in 1964. She took classes at the Walter Center for computer training. Marjorie worked at Johns Hopkins Hospital for over twenty years as a Lab Technician. In 1985, she received the prestigious Baker-King Award for her outstanding performance and contributions on her job. This is the highest award given to employees. She retired in 1994.

Marjorie was a proud member of the American Legion Post # 285 Auxiliary from April 9, 1990 to Present. The American Legion Auxiliary administers many volunteer programs, they donate many of hours of their time to various communities and to veterans. They raise money through fundraisers to

support veteran programs and charities. Before her illness, she worked on numerous committees and she loved creating banners and flyers for the American Legion's fundraisers.

As a young child, Marjorie joined the Mount Sinai Baptist Church under Pastor Edmond Meade. In later years, she joined the New David Baptist Church of Christ, under Pastor Earl Nathan Woodard where she remained a member until her death. Marjorie lived an unselfish life and was always willing to lend a hand to whomever needed it. She valued and cherished the relationships and she loved to travel with family and friends.
