



## Marlene Spriggs

August 31, 1933 - September 22, 2001

Marlene Althea Spriggs was born on August 31, 1933 in Baltimore, Maryland at Johns Hopkins Hospital, the daughter of the late Raymond Cornish and Annie Cornish-Carter. Marlene was married to Isaiah Spriggs, who preceded her in death. Marlene was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools. She graduated from Frederick Douglass High School in February 1950. She was employed at Spring Grove State Hospital as a LPN from 1974-1993. She was then transferred to Crownsville State Hospital, from which she retired in 1955. Marlene gave her life to Christ at an early age under the late Bishop T. R. Young of the Maryland Church of God in Christ. She later reunited through Christian experience at Nazarene Baptist Church on September 10, 1989 under the pastoralship of Reverend James J. Thompson. She was gifted with playing the piano and with a voice that could soothe anybody's soul. Sister Spiggs had a determined mind to serve the Lord. She was serious about her salvation. When you talked with Marlene, she always had something to say that would put a smile on your face or laughter inside you. During Sister Spiggs illness, there was never sadness about her. She continued to praise the Lord and thank Him for His blessings. She was truly a joy to be around. The Lord had prepared her for this Homegoing. Marlene passed away on Saturday, September 22, 2001, at 7:30 p.m. at Stella Maris Hospice at Mercy Hospital. Marlene had three children (one son, Damion Lionel Spriggs, preceded her in death).
