After graduating from Fair Street High School in Gainesville, Martha moved to Baltimore, Maryland in 1945 and began to work in the medical records department at Johns Hopkins Hospital. Martha was a devoted wife and dutiful mother who always put the interest of her family first. She prided herself in seeing that her boys were given loving care and spiritual nourishment. She immersed herself in the various ministries of the church and enjoyed being an active and faithful member in the Pastors Aides, Church School
