Upon graduation from school, she moved to Baltimore, Maryland and lived with her oldest sister, Annie Williams Brooks. She met and married Lonnie Lee Terry. To this union, three children were born; Gloria Terry Stanley, James Terry and Lonnie Terry. Gloria and James preceded her in death. Martha was a faithful and loyal member of Zion Baptist Church. She exemplified the Christian principles of womanhood.
