Born in Baltimore, Maryland on August 20, 1921, she was the fifth of nine gifts from God to Ella and John Holly. She was educated in the Baltimore City Schools and her thirst for knowledge about our Lord, later attended the Baltimore School of the Bible.

She married the late Floyd R. Boston on November 25, 1942. No children came out of that union and perhaps that was God's way of leaving space for her to give her love to her godchildren, Robert Leroy McLeod and Nicole Ingram Williams and the multitude that she helped raise, all the McLeods, Holleys, and their grand, great-grand and great-great-grandchildren.

Aunt Liz worked as a domestic for several families. She formed a lifelong friendship with the family of Beaufort and Cecil Stokes. They adopted each other in a bond of love.

She was a member of Sharon Baptist Church and in 1953 became a member of Gospel Tabernacle Baptist Church. She was Superintendent of Jr. and Sr. High Departments, Youth Adviser, and organized their First Basketball Team in 1978. Aunt Liz was a lifetime member of the Women's Auxiliary to the

United Baptist Missionary Convention of MD and loved working with young people.

She was like our second Mother welcoming us with open arms but giving us tough love when needed. When one of us decided to run away from home, he was worked so hard that he decided to run back.

She patiently taught us to bake Christmas cookies so crisp they would melt in your mouth. Her pineapple cake was so good that we pinched every crumb out of the last corner of the pan. she was loved and celebrated by all the generations of the family and on her final birthday here on earth, we awarded her with a crown.

After 96 years of giving love and guidance to us, don't you agree that Aunt Liz now deserved to receive her Golden Crown from the King! She will truly be missed by generations of family & friends whose lives were blessed by having Aunt Liz cross their path as she walked her Earthly Journey.
