Mary Elizabeth Moore was born on July 19, 1925 in Conway, South Carolina. She was the only surviving child of her parents, the Late Elwood Moore and Maggie "Nell" DeWitt Moore. Her father nicknamed her "Lindy" at an early age. She attended Conway public schools and graduated from Conway High School in 1942 at the age of sixteen. She attended a private finishing school in Philadelphia and graduated from Cortez Peters Business School in Baltimore, Maryland in 1945. In 1942 her father introduced her to his co-worker and good friend James Nathaniel "Nay" Johnson. Their friendship flourished in spite of Nay's induction into the Army. Nay served in Europe during World War II from 1942 until 1945. Nay and Lindy married on September 18, 1945 in Baltimore, Maryland. The couple had three children, the late James Nathaniel Jr., Barry Lynn and Toni Ilene. In 1958 Lindy started work at the Social Security Administration as a GS-1. During her tenure at SSA she attended the Community College of Baltimore and Morgan State College. 1988 Lindy retired from SSA after 30 years of service having achieved a Supervisory grade of GS-15. She turned her love for crochet into a business, Johnson's Handicrafts, in 1971. Her many accomplishments were Herculean considering that her husband was disabled in a serious automobile accident in 1960. She received great strength from her faith. Lindy attended Wayland Baptist Church regularly until her health began to fail in 1998. In 1993 Nay was diagnosed with terminal cancer. Lindy cared for him faithfully at home. She was by his side when he died on July 12, 1993. She cared for her

oldest son "Jimmy" after he was diagnosed with lung cancer until he died in July 2000. She is survived by: her son Barry L. Johnson and daughter Toni Johnson Thomas; their spouses respectively, Kith Ann Still Johnson, Michael Wilson Thomas Sr., and Jimmy's wife Montray Johnson; grandchildren, James Johnson III, Kya N. Atkinson and spouse Joel, Tiffany Lynn Johnson, Brett C. Johnson and spouse Heather, Kristi Korzec, Marnie Nichole Johnson, Megan Mason, Steven Thomas, Michael Thomas Jr.; nine great-grandchildren, cousins, other relatives and friends.
