Mary Elizabeth Tibbs was born Mary Elizabeth Gross, to Samuel and Mary Gross, in Calvert County, Maryland on May 24, 1924. She entered into paradise on Wednesday, June 22, 2005. She was a loving, caring, and dutiful wife to Charles for 50 years. She gave healing aid to her father, then her mother, and then her husband. She was affectionately called "Snoots" early on. A diminutive lady, Mary always welcomed you with a smile and a hug. She had the heart of a shepherd.
