Her strong desire to work with children motivated her to obtain a Master's Degree in Social work at Howard University in Washington, DC. Upon completion of her education she went to work for the Department of Social Services on Oliver Street. She dedicated over 35 years of her life to helping better the lives of foster children. She was married to Randolph J. Hall, and out of this union one child was born, Tammy R. Hall Johnson. From her first marriage there was one son, James E. Bright, Sr. Mary was a devoted Christian who shined her light on the world. She was a loyal member of Bethel A. M. E. for most of her life and was active in numerous committees and organizations in and outside of the church. Because of her love to sing she dedicated a lot of her time to the Senior Choir. With her outgoing personality and true conviction to help others, she blessed many lives and will be sincerely missed by everyone. Mary was known as a Poet Laureate. She had many poems and articles published by the Sun Paper and various publications. Growing up in a segregated society, she faced discrimination with a spirit of advocacy to secure not only her rights but also the rights of others, which inspired her writings.
