The first to receive that motherly love was a son, Raymond Ames, she and Uncle Hacket, would love and care for him as their very own. The family grew after many years, you see Aunt Margaret still had much more room in her heart and home, so they invited two daughters to join them, Denise and Tammy. Aunt Margaret would care for great great nieces and nephews in her life time as well, she was a natural mother.

Aunt Margaret had a special love for the Lord God and she would let you know it through song. It was nothing for her to break out into old school gospel to praise and worship the ones she knew loved her best and she shared that love with all. Later on, in her life she would come to know the same kindness and loving care that she had showered on so many others through the hands of her youngest sister, Doris. It was during this time in her life she would come to live with Doris and her brother-in-law, Cliff, at which time she'd become a long standing member of the Gospel Tabernacle Baptist Church under the leadership of Bishop Reginald L. Kennedy, Aunt Margaret would receive the right hand of fellowship and be baptized.

Aunt Margaret loved life, she especially enjoyed the pleasure and company of her family and friends, even those who were no longer here with her. The illness that struck her body would require long-term care in a nursing home facility. While there Aunt Margaret would continue receiving that same measure of loving kindness and care from her sister, Doris, who was faithful around the matters and affairs of her sister. Aunt Margaret introduced everyone who'd walk by to her mother and her sister. She kept a photo of her mother in her lap at all times and would say to folks "come here, see my mother's picture and this is my sister, Doris".

Aunt Margaret enjoyed cooking, sewing and watching her favorite soaps, "Search for Tomorrow", "As the World Turns" and "The Young and The Restless", all kinds of games, cards or board games, checkers, dominoes and her favorite TV game shows, "Wheel of Fortune" and "Jeopardy", just to name a few. Aunt Margaret was a lover of music and dance also, even when she could no longer stand under her own strength, she'd hear songs from the radio and stand and dance with the walker. Even while in her wheel chair she never stopped dancing. Infectious was her laughter and that smile of hers was captivating.

She leaves to mourn her passing: two daughters, Harriet Davis and Tammy Meyers; son-in-law, David Meyers, 8 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren; sisters, Martina Madden, Shirley Spriggs and Mable Chambers; Aunt Margaret was preceded in death by her son, Raymond Ames; life partner, Howard Hersey; brothers, William, Howard, George and James; and her sisters, Ruth and Blanche; and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

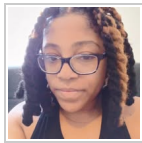
