July 4, 1923 - January 22, 2004

Mary Lee Porter (Wooten), daughter of the late Mack and Penny Porter, was born July 4, 1923 in Macclesfield, North Carolina, one of nine siblings. All of whom preceded her in death. Mary Lee was educated in the North Carolina Public School System. At an early age she accepted Christ as her personal Savior and she was an active member of the Washington Branch Baptist Church in Macclesfield. She met her late husband Rev. Ernest Wooten Jr. In 1937, after a short courtship he proposed to her, and they were married on October 24, 1939 in Emporia, Virginia. In 1943, she moved to Maryland. Shortly after settling in Baltimore she joined Mount Hebron Baptist Church where she served with her husband as a Deacon. While serving at Mount Hebron, her husband received the call from God to preach the gospel. Together they founded a church that she named Siloam Baptist church. One of her last desires was to fellowship at Siloam one more time, but her illness kept her from fulfilling that desire. As first Lady of Siloam, Sister Wooten as she was fondly called, always encouraged the church to "Hold on to God's Unchanging Hand." During her years at Siloam she served in various leadership positions, she served as president of the Missionary Board and an Agent for the Burial Society. She was also a member of the Senior Choir, the G.A.P. Choir and the District #2 Union choir. Mary Lee adored her two children, Penny and Julian and in her later years her grandsons, Nathaniel and Yazier. After a lengthy illness God called home Mary Lee on January 22, 2004. She leaves to cherish a lifetime of memories: one daughter, Penny Mae

Wooten; one son Julian Ford; two grandsons, Nathaniel Johnson and Yazier; three sisters-in-laws, Fannie Wheatley, Mary Ruth Williams, Mattie Wooten; one brother-in-law, Pastor Will Williams; a devoted niece, Forest Dupree; a devoted nephew, Fleming Wooten; one goddaughter, Annie Sharpe; one godson, Aaron Jacobs.
