Mary used her many talents in various jobs. She worked as a factory worker, and a seamstress. After her retirement she worked as a teacher's aid, a senior aid at Epiphany House and a cafeteria worker for the Archdiocese of Baltimore at the school at St. Mary's Govans. After her divorce, she moved to Woodbourne Woods where she enjoyed helping in the Thrift Store and helping to serve dinners. Mary loved the Lord. During these past four months of her illness even when she could not speak to her friends, she could still call out "Lord, have mercy on me." Mary was friendly and had a beautiful smile. She was always willing to help whenever needed. At St. Matthews she was a Eucharistic Minister, a member of the Sodality, the Liturgy Committee, the Parish Health Ministry, and the Altar Guild. Prior to this she was a very active member of St Ann's. She served on many committees there. She was also a member of the Knights and Ladies of St. Peter Claver. Although Mary never had any children of her own, she had the opportunity to help many families with their children over the years. She was Godmother to Brittany Johnson and Nyibon Garafan, and she was known as Grandmother to Biniam Habpegiorgis.
