MARY LOUISE HILL, daughter of the late Reverend Oscar Harley and the late Reverend Essie L. Harley, was born on January 8, 1919 in the Good Land Township on Orangeburg County, South Carolina. She departed this life on February 2, 2010. Mary was the eldest of five siblings; she attended school in South Carolina and Baltimore. As a young adult, she worked as a helper in a ladies' dress shop near Druid Hill Park, a waitress at a Bickford's restaurant, and as a dietician's assistant at the old Union Memorial Hospital. In 1950, she married the late John T. Hill in Ellicott City, Maryland, and out of this union, two children were born, Theresa and Stella. Affectionately nicknamed "Weezie", Mary was a loving, kind woman who always took care of her family. She was also a strong-willed, independent woman who spoke her mind, and commanded respect.
