June 6, 1921 - May 19, 2005

On Thursday, May 19, 2005, Mrs. Mary Lee Spruill Jenkins answered when she heard god's call to come home to eternal peace and rest safely in His Arms. "...The time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith". Timothy 4:6-7 Born in Warren County, North Carolina on June 6, 1921, Mary Lee was the fifth of eleven children born to the late Rev. James Shepherd Spruill (1993) and Mrs. Viola Hudgins Spruill (1995). Upon the profession of her faith, Mary Lee accepted Christ at an early age and joined the Greater Lovely Hill Baptist Church in Macon, North Carolina. Mary Lee was preceded in death by her husbands, Mr. Alonzo Kelly, Sr. and Mr. Floyd Jenkins. Also preceding her in death was her beloved son and only child, Mr. Alonzo Kelly, Jr. (1988) who was a teacher at Harlem Park Junior High school for twenty-six years, and her oldest brother, Mr. James Arthur Spruill (1989). She received her early education in the Warren County School System, and graduated from the John R. Hawkins High School in Warrenton, North Carolina. Mary continued her education at Winston Salem State University in Winston Salem, North Carolina, where she majored in Elementary Education and received her B.S. Degree. She later earned a Masters Degree in Administration and Supervision from New York University. Her academic studies culminated at the University of Los Angeles, California, where she matriculated toward a Ph.D. Degree. Mary's strong academic back ground made her an exceptional classroom instructor and she utilized her skills and talents to teach for twenty-seven years in the Baltimore

City Public School System prior to retiring. Before becoming too ill to serve and attend on a regular basis, Mary was an active member of the Concord Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland for more than thirty years and was honored by the church in 1999 for her many years of faithful and devoted service. Surviving to cherish her precious memories and her love are: three brothers, Willie Norman Spruill (Louise) and Harold Lloyd Spruill (Carrie) of Macon, North Carolina, and Rev. Nesbitt E. Spruill (Dorothy) of Rocky Mount, North Carolina, who was her guardian for the past two years; six sisters, Ruth S. Ridley of Rochester, New York, Edna S. Hill and Georgia S. Hill of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Levonia S. Jones of Hastings Hudson, New York, Dorothy S. Monroe (Roscoe) of Baltimore, Maryland and Vera S. Allen of Laurel, Maryland; a daughter-in-law, Marie, generations of nieces, nephews, cousins and a host of loving and devoted friends.
