Through her relationship with Ray of Hope Baptist Church and American Legion Post #285, she was able to provide food, clothing, aid and comfort to the sick and the elderly. After her retirement, Mary began to pursue her passion for travel and enjoying her retirement. She traveled to Alaska, Hawaii, Europe, the Caribbean, Mexico and throughout the United States. She continued her travels until she was befallen by a serious injury in 2001. During her life, she became everybody's "Mama," and an inspiration to everyone she touched. Mary was dedicated to family: spending many hours with her grandchildren and great grandchildren. Mary eagerly

expressed her love for the loved ones who preceded her in death: two husband, William Hurtt Sr. and Albert Blocker; two children, Thomas LeRoy Hurtt and Linda Mitchell; two grandchildren, Antonio Howe and Rodney King; and three siblings, Lucille Arlington, Charles Mills Sr., and Doretha King.
