Later in life she became a member of the Love Faith and Deliverance Church of Christ under the pastoral ship of the late Bishop Jimmy Smith and the late David Hatchet. After Elder Hatchet's passing she decided to serve the Lord as church mother at her grandchildren's church, Purpose Driven Ministries. As time went by Mae's

health began to fade, so of course I stepped in to give Mother the help and guidance she really needed, but she quickly informed me that I was the child, she was the parent and cautioned me to tread lightly, which I did.
