McArthur "Little Boy" Blowe, son of the late Ms. Janie Blowe and Mr. Aro Parker was born on March 14, 1943 in Murfreesboro, North Carolina. While growing up in Newsoms, Virginia, he began his education at South Hampton Training School and later completed his education in Baltimore, Maryland; where he commenced life at his own beat.

McArthur had a successful career as an Insurance Agent with Home Beneficial Life Insurance Company, serving the Baltimore Metropolitan area. For over 10 years, McArthur was a member of the top 100 Million Dollar Associates and Top Producer club for Home Beneficial Life Insurance Company, earning several awards. While working as an insurance agent he met Ms. Gloria Whitehead; they wed on October 25, 1975, and from this union Angela and Jason Blowe were born.

McArthur was a patriarch and faithful man to his family. McArthur enjoyed attending family reunions and gathering which he deeply enjoyed.
