Michael was raised in Turner Station, Maryland. He attended and graduated from Dundalk Senior High School. Upon graduation he enrolled in a Technical School, where he received his certification as an Engineer Technician. Michael dedicated his life to his country by serving in the U.S. Army where he fought in the Gulf War. After the war, he was employed at the Veterans Hospital and later he worked for the State Highway Administration.
