Michael Warren Dailey, son of Albert Preston and Gertrude Emma, was born on December 15, 1951, in Baltimore, Maryland. Michael was the youngest of four children. Michael departed this life on January 4, 2019. Both parents, and his older brother Albert P. Dailey, Jr. (“Sunny”), preceded him in death.

He received his education at Baltimore City College, earned an Associate of Arts Degree from the Community College of Baltimore, and a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Baltimore. He also completed graduate courses at Loyola University in Baltimore. He became employed at Westinghouse Electric Corporation (now Northrop Grumman) as an Accountant, Computer Programmer, and Database Administrator. As he developed an affinity for computers and technology, he earned multiple programming language certifications and was hired by several companies to lead Information Systems and Information Technology departments. His positions included: Assistant Vice-President of Information Systems at Union Memorial Hospital, and Director of Information Technology at Keswick Multi-Care Center.

He married his college sweetheart, Brenda Boddie, and out of this union two daughters were born, Monica and Erika. He was baptized at the New Antioch Baptist Church of Randallstown, August 22, 1993. He later attended Bridgeway Community Church in Columbia, Md. While enduring illness, he enjoyed Dr. Tony Evans, Jack Graham and Touching Lives Pastor James Merritt.

Michael was a spontaneous, athletic and fun husband, dad, friend, colleague, basketball coach, and mentor. He was generous with giving, including leaving hefty tips, treating his productive work teams to expensive lunch outings, and being a loyal and favorite customer. He was encouraging, enjoyed sharing, teaching, preparing, helping, guiding, and leading many of all ages, in any way he was able. Especially after a neighbor built a basketball court in the backyard, The Dailey home became even more of a neighborhood gathering center for the children in the Campfield/Lochearn/Woodmoor area as well as for hosts of basketball team meetings, neighborhood fun, and team play. His training produced very competitive and ambitious daughters. He coached recreational and AAU basketball, traveling across the country, meeting current and coaching a few future WNBA players. He loved to surprise his wife with cruises and trips, and treasured family time and providing unique experiences and exposure to all three of 'Mike's girls'. Michael was a role model for future husbands, fathers, coaches, and mentors, and will forever be remembered as a meticulous, but hilarious, patriarch. He will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him because of his indelible and gracious spirit.
