As an adult, Mickey worked for the Union at Montgomery Wards. He retired from the G Heileman Brewery, but continued to work for Clifton Park Golf

Course. Bowling was also something he enjoyed.

Mickey married Sharon Berry on April 26, 1980. Together they loved and raised Cher'Von. Family has always been the center of his world. Whether you called him Dad, Mick, Uncle Mickey, Honey, or "Sug", you had to know not to mess up his hair, and that he liked "a little coffee with his sugar". He also loved bacon. On any cruise you could find him on the Lido Deck with a plate of bacon! At home he was busy being Pop-Pop to Sanaa.

In March of this year, Mickey reaffirmed that he accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior. He remembered being baptized in the river while he was a little boy in Georgia. "They dunked me and John under..... that creek water was cold."

Peacefully, he took his journey home on May 1, 2018.

Mickey has a legacy of family who love and appreciate him. They can each remember his jokes and his humor. He leaves his wife, Sharon Williams to celebrate his life.
