June 7, 1930 - February 6, 2008

Mildred Anderson, the oldest daughter of Edith Glover and Jerry Glover, was born June 7, 1930 in Baltimore, Maryland. She had one sister, Ophelia Glover-Hall, and two brothers, Jerry Glover and Freddie Glover. Mildred stated working at the tender age of thirteen in various hotels in the downtown area of Baltimore City. When she was in her twenties, she had two children, Ida Mae Hollie and James Green. Mildred later took a job and moved to Jamaica, Long Island, New York, where she worked as a nanny for a prominent doctor there. After working in New York for three years, she came home and later met and married John McBride Sr. They had four children, Loretta, John, Ronald and Ernestine McBride. After her divorce, she met and married Robert Anderson Sr. in June of 1961. Out of this union they had two sons, one deceased and Robert Anderson Jr. During the last twenty years, Robert and Mildred received Jesus Christ as their personal Savior in the 1970's. They attended East Baltimore Deliverance Church where Pastor Christina Phillips (now Holsclaw) was Pastor. Now called Mother Anderson, she served as the President of the Usher Board, member of the Flower Circle, and Vice President of the Deaconess Board. Her continued spiritual growth led her to attend Wailing Walls Church of Deliverance. She became the Mother of the Church and Elder under the leadership of her daughter, Pastor Loretta Johnson. On February 6, 2008, the Lord called her home after the death of her husband of forty-six years. She leaves behind to mourn; her children, Pastor Loretta Johnson, John McBride, Ernestine Epps, Robert Anderson Jr., Bishop Ronald McBride and
