



## Millard L. Pack, Sr.

April 29, 1928 - May 13, 2022

Millard Lowell Pack, Sr. was born on April 29, 1928, to Jason Asbury and Carrie L. Pack of Severna Park, MD. He attended Carver High School, and left to “enter” the U.S. Army in November of 1945, serving until 1947. Upon his return, he attended the Maryland Academy of Art and graduated in May of 1950.

Along with his love for art, Millard was also an accomplished boxer. He began his amateur boxing career at the Y.M.C.A and at Carver High School in 1944. Prior to his entry into the Army, he won the 1945 Baltimore City Championship and in the same year went on to become the runner-up in the National Golden Glove Championship in St. Louis, MO. While serving in the Army in 1946 he was the lightweight runner-up in München, Germany. After his discharge from the Army, he went on to win the South Atlantic A.A.U Welterweight Championship by defeating “Willy Jackson”. He had impressive amateur boxing record of 38-2. Millard turned professional in 1949 and fought until 1956. He was inducted into the Maryland Boxing Hall of Fame in 1992.

Millard began working as a tractor operator at the Bethlehem Steel Company in Sparrows Point, MD in 1951. During breaks and lunch hours he could be found sketching on the back of his timecards and other work documents. One of his drawings was used briefly as the logo for the Steelworkers Credit Union and his charcoal portrait of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr was displayed in the

Turners Station branch of the Baltimore County Public Library for many years.

Millard was introduced to a shy girl named Antonia (Ann) Marie Lopez by her outgoing sister Lolita at a party. Ann became the apple of his eye and spice of his life! They were lovingly united in marriage on September 27, 1947.

From this blessed union nine souls were born; Phillip (Tony), Millard Jr. (Mike), Karl, Brian, Steve, Aaron, Mildred, Corey, and Joseph (Joe). They created a home filled with love, joy, and laughter for 52 years. Through the pains and trials of life they remained steadfast by each other's side, setting an example of love and perseverance for generations to come.

He peacefully departed this life, joining his beloved Ann, on Friday, May 13, 2022. His spirit lives on in the cherished memories of his daughter Mildred Fleming (Edward), sons Phillip (Gloria), Millard Jr. (Jennifer), Karl (Faye), Brian (Phyllis), Steve (Linda), Aaron (Leslie), Corey (Maria), and Joseph, Sr. (Antoinette), along with 30 grandchildren, 36 great-grandchildren, 2 great-great-grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends.
