Affectionately called “Didda” by her family, Millicent received her formal education in Baltimore City Schools and was a lifelong learner. Her love of education motivated her to assist many young people in pursuing post-secondary educational experiences.

A devoted and dedicated parishioner of St. Matthew Catholic Church, she was a faithful member of the Sodality Committee, which oversees the financial affairs of the church. Millicent loved to dance and watch sports. An avid fan of the Baltimore Orioles, she enjoyed receiving Orioles Memorabilia.

Most notable was Millicent’s entrepreneurship skills. She was a successful businesswoman, operating Millie’s Card and Gift Shop in the Maryland State Office Building. Additionally, she operated several small businesses through Blind Industries Services of Maryland (BISM), an organization in which she served as an Advisory Board Trustee. As a member of several profession and community groups, such as “The Red Hatters of Govans”, “Civic and

Religious Emergency Services” (CARES), “Govans Ecumenical Development Corporation” (GEDCO) and the “New Northwood Neighborhood Association”, Millicent’s commitment to these organizations was noteworthy.

Millicent traveled numerous places in and out of the country, attending National Federation of the Blind (NFB) conventions all over the country for many years.

There, she was always taking an active role in all of it’s programs. In addition, she was an active member of local chapters of the NFB and Professional Interest Group, which was a fundraiser for students of her beloved Morgan State University.
