MILLIE MACKLIN, daughter of the late John Plummer and the late Mary Ann Perry, was born on October 24, 1943 in Inez, North Carolina. She departed this life on July 24, 2008 after a lengthy illness. She received her education at Vaughan Elementary School in Vaughan, North Carolina. She went on to Warren Training School in Wise, North Carolina where she graduated in 1961. Millie moved to Brooklyn, New York and attended New York University, where she received her Bachelor's degree. She worked for the Administration for Children Services, where she was a social worker. While working there, Millie furthered her education by obtaining her Master's degree, and afterwards she became a supervisor of the Administration of Children Services. She remained employed there for thirty-four years (May 20, 1968 - May 15, 2002), until her retirement. Millie attended New Born House of God under the leadership of Pastor Pittman and because of the branching out of the ministry, she was then under Pastor Caughman in Brooklyn, New York. She became a born again Christian. In 2002, Millie relocated to Dover, Delaware, where she joined the Holy Temple Holiness Church of Deliverance in Baltimore, Maryland. She was under the leadership of her sister, the late Pastor Julia Williams. After the passing of her sister she was under the leadership of Bishop James and Senior Pastor Greta Tilghman (niece and nephew), where she became a mother of the church. Mother Millie Macklin was predeceased by her adopted daughter Louise Lavern Veals (Russell). She leaves to mourn: two grandchildren, Russell III (Trey) and Alexander both of Virginia; two

sisters, Mother Mary Dorsey (James) of Baltimore, Maryland; Associate Pastor Alma Jackson (Stonewall) of Dover, Delaware; adopted sister, Doris Foreman of Baltimore, Maryland. She also leaves to mourn: her aunt, Arlene Alston of North Carolina; many nieces and nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends too numerous to name.
