



## Milton Pope

October 18, 1932 - April 7, 2003

Milton Pope, son of the late Ulysses and Reaver Pope, was born on October 18, 1932 in Nash County, North Carolina. After a short illness, he departed this life on April 7, 2003. Milton attended Booker T. Washington High School in Rocky Mount, NC, Instructor School, US. Naval Station in Norfolk, VA, and San Diego Evening College in San Diego, CA where he received his AA degree. Milton enlisted in the United States Navy in August 1952. He was transferred from active duty to the Fleet Reserve of the United States Navy on October 4, 1971, after 20 years of service. He received numerous decorations, medals, and campaign ribbons for his years of service to the Navy. Milton received the following medals and awards for his bravery and conduct in the United States Navy: Navy Unit Commendation Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal (5th Award), Vietnam Service Medal, and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Milton toured several countries and visited many sites all across the world. After retiring from the service, he resided in San Diego, California where he attended the "Ambassador for Christ Baptist Church." Milton was an avid reader; his collection of books exceeded well over 300 assorted copies, from History to Art, Law to Accounting. Milton also loved to draw and listen to music of all kinds, which consisted of a collection of Old Negro Spirituals and hymnals. On May 31, 2002, Milton moved to Baltimore, MD to be close to his remaining family and friends. Milton is survived by one sister, Gertrude P. Henderson of Baltimore, MD; one brother, Ernest Clary of Blackstone, VA; a devoted goddaughter, Velma Barney of Dundalk, MD; one

sister-in-law, Aileen Pope; a host of nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews and friends; a special great-niece, Yavone Baker of Baltimore, MD, who loved him dearly.
