She was also known for her evening gown creations. At Easter, she designed and sewed matching outfits for her and her three daughters. She was a wonderful caregiver for her family and friends, especially for her mother-in-law, Marie E. Jones. She taught her children to be nature and animal lovers, and usually had a pet in her home. Earlier in life she was an outdoorswoman who loved to fish and camp. She gardened and preserved the harvest yearly. She lived in Dayton, Tennessee for twenty-five years before coming to Baltimore, Maryland. Tine and her twin, Earnestine Locke of Dayton, Tennessee kept in touch by phone, until they both became too ill to carry on the tradition. She was preceded in death by her parents, five sisters, five brothers, and a grandson, Earl Mitchell. Until recently, she lived with and was lovingly cared for by her daughter, Marilyn M. Clayton of Baltimore, Maryland. She is also survived by two other daughters, Constance Reid and Doris E. Mitchell also of Baltimore; her sister, Margaret Brown of Roanoke, Virginia; four granddaughters, Regina Williams, Tanya Waltrick, Tina Hill and Sherrie Copes; seven great-grandchildren, many nephews, nieces, nephews and friends.
