Monica (Babsy) Leanora Jones, daughter of the late John Evans and the late Ethel Millwood, was born on May 4, 1941 in Kingston, Jamaica. Sadly, she departed this life on February 14, 2014 after battling various illnesses for many years.

Although she lost her parents at a young age, Monica held fast to the values she was taught by the Sisters of Mercy and the Keene's who adopted her as one of their own. Upon her graduation from Alpha, Monica worked at different jobs mainly in hotels on the North and East Coasts of the island before making a permanent move to the United States.

After relocating to the U.S., Monica resided in Annapolis, Maryland, where she met and married the late William D. Jones. While in Annapolis, Monica worked at the Naval Academy as a Seamstress. She was a very jovial and caring person; and the midshipmen quickly became fond of her. She would very often welcome and entertain them at her home. Being very ambitious and hard-working, Monica always looked for opportunities to develop her own business and become independent. Along with receiving her certificate for the art of fitting from the Bali Company, Monica attended the Fleet Division-ITT

Business Institute as well as other short trade courses and programs, and always sought ways to improve her skills.

She worked at several jobs which included as a crossing guard, a distributor for personalized children's books, a seamstress at home, as well as doing alterations at Garfinckel's and Macy's. Monica loved to travel, and to take videos/photos. Where ever she went, her camera(s) and video-recorder went with her. After her husband passed away, Monica moved to Arnold, Maryland, where she became a member of St. Andrew by the Bay Catholic Church. Monica later settled in Glen Burnie, Maryland.
