Taking his grandchildren to the Maryland State Fair was the highlight of his summer. Family and friends always expected one of his baked sweet potato pies and a slice of coconut cake at Thanksgiving and Christmas. He was a founding member of Mt. Zion Hill Baptist Church under the late Dr. Clarence Poole Sr. and served as Deacon and then becoming Chairman of the Deacon Ministry. He was also a member Deacons Conference of Baltimore and

Vicinity.
