June 21, 1915 - November 10, 2004

Moses Blease Mahoney was born on June 21, 1915 in Summerton, South Carolina. He was the youngest of three children born to Rev. Robert M. Mahoney and Effie Esaline Parson Mahoney. Following the death of his mother when he was three years of age, Moses, his brother John, and sister Dorothy, were raised by their maternal grandparents, John and Angeline Parsons. Under the care and tutelage of his grandmother, Moses regularly attended Taw Caw Missionary Baptist Church and accepted Christ at an early age. His favorite bible passage was the 23rd Psalm, which he recited at all family gatherings. As a young adult, Moses worked in the lumber mills in Manning, S.C. During this period he met, wooed and married Clara Gamble. From this union, two girls, Dorothy and Flora were born. In 1945, Moses moved his family to Baltimore, Maryland, where he worked for several years as a truck driver for the Western Maryland Dairy Company. He later gained employment with Luskins, where he worked until his retirement. Moses, also affectionately known as "Cunning" by family members, always had an outgoing, happy-go-lucky personality. He made many friends during his lifetime and loved children and animals. Moses was also an avid checkers player. He seldom lost a match and was able to play well into his eighties. After combating illness in the last few years, Moses was called home on November 10, 2004, just two short months after his sister, Dorothy Cyrus. He is survived by: his devoted daughters, Dorothy M. Gray and Flora L. Williams both of Baltimore, Maryland; a son, Steve Mahoney of Patterson, New Jersey; a son-in-law,

Clarence Williams; seven grandchildren, eleven great-grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends.
