Mozelle Lucia (burns) Guinn was born on February 16, 1925, in Baltimore, Maryland. She was the fourth children of seven children, born to the late Manning and Lucinda Burns. She quietly and peacefully entered into her Master's eternal rest on Saturday June 22, 2019.

Mozelle (affectionately known as "Moe" by her family) accepted Christ as her Savior at an early age at Faith Baptist Church, and has worshipped at several Baptist churches in Baltimore, Maryland. She received her academic training in the Baltimore City Public School System and Dunbar High School from 1939 to 1941.

She married Thomas Guinn Jr., her childhood sweetheart, after he returned from his military duty on May 11, 1946. The two were inseparable until he was called home on January 19, 1991. Two children are surviving this blessed union.

She worked faithfully for the Department of Social Services for over 20 years, until she was declared medically disabled in 1986 due to chronic lymphedema (Elephantitis) in both her lower legs.

Mozelle lived a long full happy life. She ha seen and heard more in a lifetime than most, including witnessing our nation's first African American president.

She most enjoyed spending time with her family. She loved family gatherings in any form, listening to music and dancing was her favorite of all. Even with the loss of her legs she would dance in her chair and pump her arms and hands in the air. Some may be surprised, but she was a fan of watching WWF wrestling, golf and figure skating. She also had a small addiction to shopping from magazines and QVC TV. She was a devoted loving wife and mother. She loved her children, Lisa and Tommy, it was nothing in this world she wouldn't do for them and she insured they had a happy and healthy childhood. Her spirit was one of a kind, no matter what trials or tribulations were presented, including losing both her legs, she remained positive. She was very thoughtful and kind, but she would not ever hesitate to tell you exactly what was on her mind. Her favorite saying was "be satisfied with what you have and don't ever worry about what you don't have".

Mozelle leaves to cherish her memory: her children, Lisa and Thomas III; seven grandchildren, Terry, Ashley, Thomas IV, Lacia, Lache, Maze and Kahara; two sisters, Alzie Berry, and her husband Moses Berry and Ethel Burns; and a host of great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, other relative and friends. She was predeceased by her beloved husband of forty-five years, Thomas Guinn Jr.; two sisters, Miriam Stokes and Dolores Burns (infant); two brothers, Manning Burns, Jr. and Wilbert Burns Sr.; daughter-in-law, Lizette Guinn; and grandson, Kajuan Guinn.
