After graduating from Baltimore City College he entered the United States Army where he served in Korea as a paratrooper in the distinguished 82nd Airborne Division. Muhammad attended Coppin State College in Baltimore, Md. and received degrees from Charter Oak College and Connecticut College in New London, Connecticut. Muhammad was often seen on the campus of Connecticut College as he served as a volunteer for alumni functions and as a Marshall at commencement ceremonies. His family is the first legacy family of Connecticut College. Muhammad was a very spiritual and loving man with a charismatic personality that drew people to him. His warm personality coupled with his vast knowledge of an array of subjects allowed him to connect with many people who saw his special ways. The highlight of his life was in 1964 when he joined the Nation of Islam. He was a minister and also administrator of the Islamic Outreach Fund. Muhammad will be missed by all the lives he touched. A devoted family man, gifted scholar, caring neighbor, wonderful friend, devout Muslim, are just a few ways to describe him. His quick wit and talent for relating to people makes him an unforgettable person. He leaves us all with a lifetime of incredible memories to cherish and that we are thankful for.
