MYA WOOD HILLIARD closed her eyes and entered her eternal rest on Friday, June 1, 2018.

Mya was born on September 28, 1952 in Baltimore, Maryland, the daughter of George Thomas II and Lorraine McDowell Wood. She was preceded in death by her father.

Mya was a 1974 graduate of Morgan State College, where she was initiated into the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority and earned her BS Degree in Elementary Education. Mya married and divorced Captain Turhan Robinson. Mya joined the U.S. Army in 1974 and served as Rank Specialist 4th Class Level Top Secret-Field Communication Electronics and was honorably discharged in 1977. Mya taught at the Frankfurt American School in Frankfurt, Germany for a year and returned to the States. She worked as an Electronic Technician with a Top Secret Security Clearance for Southwestern Bell and CECO Engineering in Houston and Dallas, Texas. She also worked for Motorola in Washington, DC, and Bendix Field Engineering Corp. in Columbia, Maryland from 1985 until that company folded. Of note, while working for Bendix, Mya headed the United Way Campaign and was credited for exceeding the campaign goal by 27% over the agency's pledge representing 100.4% of the company's goal. Mya was also married to and divorced Nelson Hilliard. Mya lived her life to the fullest. She traveled to numerous countries including

Israel, Greece, Holland, Switzerland, and Jerusalem while she was in the army and after her discharge.

Mya was baptized at Douglas Memorial Community Church where she was a lifelong member and also served as an usher.
