Myron Anthony White was born the second child and only son to the late Arthur shields White and the late Elaine Mabel White on October 9, 1957, He was preceded in death by his younger brother, Arthur Shields White Jr,

As a child, Myron attended and was baptized at St. Peter Claver Catholic Church. He was educated in the BCPSS where he obtained his diploma from Lake Clifton Senior High School in 1975; and obtained his Associates Degree in Electrical Engineering at DeVry University IN Vorhees, NJ in 1977. After graduating from college, he enlisted in the United States Army in 1977 where he grew to obtain the rank of sergeant, E-5 until he discharged in 1986.

Myron met and married Darlene Denise Johnson in November 1978. From this union came his one and only son, Dominic Damian White. Although their marriage ended, their friendship, respect, and love for each other remains.

After being discharged from the U.S. Army, Myron was employed with the Veterans Administration. He found gainful employment with The Longshoremen's Association until 2015. He later returned to work at the Veterans Administration where he remained until sudden passing.

Myron enjoyed dancing; playing basketball, and skating; whether on ball #5s in the neighborhood or at a roller rink. As an avid card shark in Atlantic City,

Poker was his game of choice and being known as a Whale, he enjoyed all the benefits that accompanied the title.

Never claiming to be innocent or perfect, Myron suffered with the disease of addiction for years, In 2020 he decided to work toward his sobriety via The Baltimore Station, and was striving to reach his goal daily. A gentle and respectful young man, Myron loved fashion and would wear it well ... with swag in his step, a kango on his head, and a toothpick in his mouth. God quietly called and he responded on June 23, 2022. As a Veteran, he will be remembered and respected; as a man, he will truly be loved and missed.
