Nakia Trena Mitchell, was born on February 23, 1975 to Richard Mitchell and the late Helen Marie Christian. On May 31, 2018, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ called Nakia Trena Mitchell home to her eternal rest and victory.

Nakia, affectionately known as Kia and Katie Mary received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Frederick Douglas High School. Nakia received Associate's Degree in Business Administration, from Baltimore City Community College. Nakia worked at University of Maryland department of radiology for several years where she obtained her desire to work in the medical field. Nakia worked in the Department of Radiology at Sinai Hospital for 22 years, from which she retired. Nakia was the first employee to receive the Josie King Award. This award recognizes staff who prevented harm and reported under the Just Culture principles is a Good Catch and Patient Safety Hero award. The award is dedicated to the memory of Josie, an eighteen month-old who died Feb. 22, 2001 from medical errors. The Just Culture Team at Sinai reviewed Nakia Mitchell's submissions and selected her as a Safety Champion embodying everything that the Hero Award stands for.

Nakia gave her life to Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ around 16 years of age at the First Apostolic Faith Church, under the leadership of Bishop Corneilus Showell. She was baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ in

1991. On March 11, 2017 at 5:00am in the morning Nakia was standing in the kitchen when God visited her and gave her the precious gift of the Holy Spirit with evidence of speaking in tongues. She was so excited that she couldn't keep it to herself. She called everyone to share her joy and happiness. She told Jayla and Javonta this was the best gift that you could every get and make sure they ask God for it and he would give it to them. Nakia loved her Bishop and First Lady Showell, church, and the saints, Nakia started attending Forward Ministries under the leadership of Pastor Gregory Gainey and First Lady Dennell Gainey. Nakia proclaimed that she had dual membership at First Apostolic and Forward Ministries.

Nakia tirelessly provided loving kind care for her mother Helen until her death and her aunt Mona until her death and continued to care for her aunt Foolsie until her health declined. Nakia would talk to many people and encourage them that Jesus was the answer and to turn it over to him and he would work it out. Nakia's unselfish sacrifice of loving care for family members has left an indelible mark on her children of the importance of caring for loved ones. She nurtured her children with her with love, support, and encouragement creating a bond that Jayla and Javonta call her their best friend. She never forgot a birthday, and she loved to laugh, joke, play games, and talk about life. She always made life fun for Jayla and Javonta making sure that their spirits always felt light. Nakia was so honored, excited, and proud when she was asked to be the Godmother to Lily Aria Joy Gainey.

She loved her father Richard Mitchell. He was committed to taking care of her from birth to the day she left this life. He was a faithful father until the very end. There was never a time he wouldn't come when she called him, no matter what time of the day or night it was. He'd be there!
