



Nannie Mae Glenn

February 11, 1928 - July 25, 2002

Nannie T. Glenn was born on February 11, 1928 in Washington, D.C. to the late Lonnie and Eugenia Meredith. She departed this life July 25, 2002 after a sudden illness. Nannie's departure was a clear example of someone who had a "special relationship" with GOD. There was no suffering or pain. Nannie attended the Third Baptist Church in Washington, D.C. and was baptized there on November 13, 1939 at the age of eleven years of age. She was educated in the Public Schools in Washington, D.C., entered the Federal Government during 1943 and retired in 1975, after having served thirty years. The last five years of her career were spent at the White House in the Executive Office of the United States President, where she worked as a Communications and Record Analyst Clerk. On August 20, 1964 Nannie was united in marriage to the late Benjamin Norman Glenn. One child, Quentin Turgot Glenn was born from the marriage. Nannie was also mother to Benjamin's two children, Benjamin Gregory Glenn, Sr. and Greta Teresa Glenn Hines; love and happiness resided in this household. Belief and trust in GOD was what made this union so Blessed. Nannie loved missionary work and was very active in this field. She traveled to different places touching the lives of others with the special gift GOD had given her. Nannie was anointed by the Holy Spirit in 1994 at a Baptist Convention in Memphis, Tennessee and she enjoyed to the highest where this anointing led her. As a vessel of GOD the "Kingdom of GOD" was her focus and she committed not to neglect it. In April of 1998 GOD gave Nannie a vision to build a church.

Construction of the church began immediately by her two sons. The first service at the church was held on April 26, 1998. In October 1997 the name "Trinity Circle Ministries" was given to the church by the LORD in vision to Nannie. The image of a circle and a triangle connected under the circle was firmly planted in Nannie's mind through the vision. Nannie researched to find the definition of this vision. She found that the triangle represented the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit (three concerned persons) and the circle represented a heavenly body. As a result, the name Trinity Circle Ministries for the church was given life. Nannie officially became "Servant Nannie Glenn" for the church and her oil anointing ministry. Nannie's survivors are: her youngest son Quentin T. Glenn; daughter-in-law, Tiffany Glenn; oldest son, Benjamin Gregory Glenn, Sr.; daughter-in-law, Cheryl D. Glenn; daughter Greta Teresa Glenn Hines; son-in-law, Lawrence Dwight Hines; grandchildren, Travis Glenn, Brandon Glenn, Benjamin Gregory Glenn, Jr.; Steven Glenn, Karen Glenn Bowman, Dwight Hines, Joshua Hines, Michael Hines and Jasben Hines; three great-grandchildren; aunts, Leola Foster and Mamie Riley; three sisters-in-law, nieces, nephews, cousins and many, many friends.
