On June 25, 2004 Nannie Mae went home to be with her God, after a long illness. She was a faithful member of Southern Baptist Church until her health failed her. Nannie Mae was born on July 16, 1923. She was the biological daughter of Connie Lambert Tucker and Clarence Tucker. Nannie Mae never knew her birth mother she was raised by the late Sadie I. Rice. Mrs. Rice was also her aunt. She raised Nannie as her own child, along with her own children. She attended public school in Dinwiddie County and Brunswick County. She was baptized and belonged to Springfield Baptist Church. Later years her family moved to Brunswick County, there she joined the Little Mt. Baptist Church and remained a member until she moved to Baltimore in 1947 where she joined the Southern Baptist Church, she sang on The Senior Choir # 1, and served wherever she could. On June 29, 1957, she married Herman Mitchell, there were no children to this union, he preceded her in death. George Peabody Library and the Enoch Pratt Free Library of Baltimore City employed her for 38 years, where she retired. Nannie Mae then moved back to Va., there she was a member of the Senior Missionary Circle, and belonged to the Pastor Aid.
