Natasha Monique Hargis (Tasha), daughter of Emanuel Dixon and Valeria D. Hargis, was born on July 21, 1986. She was raised in South Baltimore by her paternal Aunt, Sherley Lee (Charlene) and Uncle Ronald Barton. Tasha departed this life suddenly on Saturday, November 27, 2021.

Tasha was educated in the Baltimore City School System, graduating from Benjamin Franklin High School in 2004.
