January 25, 1943 - March 13, 2020

Nathaniel Lee, son of the late Ruth and Robert Lee was born January 25, 1943 in Baltimore, Maryland and left us peacefully on March 13, 2020. He is going off to join his brothers, Robert, John, David, Eugene and Donald Lee.

Nathaniel attended Carver High School and graduated in 1961, receiving his high school diploma. Nathaniel also attended Morgan State University and graduated in 1972 with honors, a 3.8 average, and received a B.S degree (Bachelor of Science).

Nathaniel worked 15 years for the Baltimore City School system, 5 years for the Baltimore City's Mayor Office as "Intake Coordinator", another 15 years for the Division of Rehabilitation Service Maryland State Dept. of Education, and 5 years Baltimore City Police Dept. as "Intake Counselor". Nathaniel finally retired from the Community Institute of Bon Secours, Baltimore Health Behavioral Services as "Rehab. Specialized Manager".

Nathaniel Lee, Regimental #RA 13729485 served in the Army from June 1961-1968 where he fought in the Vietnam War. Nathaniel was drafted in the service in 1961 where he was discharged with honors. He received the Metal of High Honor for his heroic efforts to save his team and was shot in the process, earning him the Purple Heart. Nathaniel was also a paratrooper and was ranked as Sergeant E-5.

Nathaniel married Lo'Retta Nixon after the death of his mother as a dying wish and divorced after a few years. Later, he met Carolyn L. Walker which he dated for 9 years and married on June 16th, 1989. Nathaniel and Carolyn Lee were married for 40 years. From this union, they had Natrell Shawn Lee, born March 20, 1985, whom he leaves behind along with his daughter Natasha Lee-Martin, son Edward Lee, stepdaughters Aisha K. Colbert and Lakina McDowell, grandchildren Tashae Pitts, Teniya Pitts, Daesha Martin, Nesbitt Rodgers III, D'Alante Burrell, A'Bria McDowell, Keith Felton, and Kamille Felton; as well as other relatives and friends, sister in law Mary Lee and Carolyn Lee and nieces and nephews Ruth, Terry, Mark, Eugene, Christina, Ronald, and Adrian Lee.
