He spent 34 years at Maryland Shipyard & Drydock Company. Nathaniel met the love of his life, Mary E. Wheeler. They were married August 20, 1973. No children were born of this union. During their life together, they traveled from the East Coast to the West Coast, hitting most cities in the United States. After retirement, he became an avid horticulturist. His home garden had plenty of flowers and vegetables. He loved working inside and outside his home. He recognized and accepted Christ at an early age. In 1995, Pastor William Outing baptized him at the Gordon St. Church in South Carolina. Nathaniel was a caring person and a true friend to those he allowed to enter his life. His famous last words "I'm waiting for her." (her, being his wife, Mary). Early

Saturday morning, May 22, 2004, he quietly slipped away from life to a tranquil place of rest.
