



Nathaniel Woodus

April 28, 1930 - May 23, 2012

Nathaniel Woodus, son of Arthur and Cecelia, was born on April 28, 1930 in Chestertown, Maryland. He departed this life on May 23, 2012 at Season's Hospice Center in Baltimore, Maryland. Nathaniel attended Garnett High School and received his high school diploma in 1948. Garnett was the only high school student of color who could attend in Kent County, Maryland at that time.

The following year, on February 1, 1949, Nathaniel enlisted in the United States Army and served his country for more than three years. His military career included an eighteen month tour of duty during the Korean War at the 10th Station Hospital. There, Nathaniel served as a Physician's Assistant and was also awarded the Korean Service Medal with three Bronze Stars, the United Nations Service Medal and the Good Conduct Medal. He was honorably discharged, holding the rank of Corporal on June 12, 1952.

Nathaniel was employed by the Veterans Affairs Administration after his discharge from military service. He served as a Nurse's Assistant at Veterans Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland from 1953 through 1985. Nathaniel retired after thirty-two years of service to military veterans and their families.

Nathaniel also married the former Doris Corinthian Butler. Together they raised eight children, Alfred, Gary, Beverly, Raft, Ivy, Brian, Francis and

Darron. Nathaniel was known by the nickname “Tinky” to family and friends. He was hard-working, a man of few words, preferred quiet, drama-free living, was always aware of current events, enjoyed reading and loved listening to jazz. Nathaniel was a compassionate man as well. He and Doris offered their home to friends and family when there was a need.

Many family members have preceded Nathaniel in homegoing. These include: his parents, Arthur and Cecelia; one brother, Arthur; one sister-in-law, Marian; two sons, Alfred and Brian; many dearly loved family members and close friends.

Nathaniel leaves to mourn and celebrate his life: his wife, Doris; a sister, Estelle; four sons; two daughters; thirteen grandchildren, James, Damon, Nathaniel, Eric, Calvin, Lauren, Nicholas, Shauna, Allison, Aleesa, Christina, Summer and Trinity; seven great-grandchildren, Shamal, Aliayna, Natanya, Jaylen, Eric, Z’niya and Eniyah; three nieces; six nephews; many close cousins and friends.
