Nelson was educated in the Richmond Public Schools and graduated from Maggie L. Walker High School. Upon his graduation from high school, Nelson joined the United States Army, and at the time of his honorable discharge, he had reached the rank of sergeant. Nelson was a hard worker. He was employed at Philip Morris as a lab technician for 29 years and 6 months before retiring. He had many part time jobs, and before his health failed him, he worked with the Community Business Group and the Downtown Clean and Safe Program as a city ambassador. Nelson also liked fun. He loved music and had an extensive album and CD collection of jazz. He was an avid runner and participated in 15 Richmond Marathons, and as anyone who knew him could attest, Nelson loved clothes. He was meticulous in his dress and looked as if he just stepped out of a GQ magazine. Nelson was preceded in death by his mother and father. He is survived by his brother, Jeffrey and his sister-in-law Nancy; his uncle Bernard Booker (Barbara); his aunt Henrietta Logan; his uncle Clarence Cook; and his aunt Delores O. Booker.
