Noah Beasley was born to parents Hattie and William Beasley on November 25, 1926. Noah was the youngest of seven children raised in Matthews, Georgia and attended Wadley High School. In 1943, he moved to St. Louis, Missouri, where he worked at General Electric until 1945 when he was called to serve in the United States Armed Forces. Upon his discharge from the armed services, he returned to St. Louis where he worked for twenty years as a baker at White Bakery. While living in St. Louis, he met and married the former Freddie M. Williams. To this union four children were born. In 1954, he and his wife accepted the third angel's message and were baptized by Elder C. E. Bradford. In 1966, he became a full-time Literature Evangelist and in 1969 he was voted Literature Evangelist of the Year for the central union. In 1970, Noah received a call to be Associate Publishing Director for the Allegheny East Conference. He labored in this Conference for fourteen years during which time he was responsible for the baptism of four hundred souls into the Seventh-Day Adventist Church. Noah, a devoted husband and father, predeceased by his son, Vincent Beasley, leaves to mourn his departure those who cherished and endeared him most; his wife, Freddie; his sister, Georgian (Walter) Roland; a brother, Dorsey (Josephine) Beasley; his daughter-in-law, Joyce Jordan Beasley; Rodney (Denise) Beasley, Mitch (Roland) Smothers, Lisa Beasley; his nine grandchildren, Orlando, Antonio, Dawn, Byron, Brenda, Tiffany, Courtney, Melisa and Tammy; twelve great-grandchildren and a host of other relatives, friends and church family
