NORVIN DARRELL JONES, son of Gloria and the late Warren Donald Jones, was born on January 29, 1958 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life suddenly on November 3, 2022 after a brief illness.

He was preceded in death by his father Donald; sisters Pamela, Towanda, Danielle; brothers Charles, Nicholas; son Darrell.
