Birt was raised in Oklahoma and matriculated through the Tulsa County school system. After completing high school he joined the United States Army. He received the National Defense Service Medal for his combat service during the Korean War. Birt worked various jobs in construction and as a cab driver. After his retirement he returned to the workforce as a driver for Woods Adult Daycare, transporting patients. Birt departed this life suddenly on Friday, October 13, 2006. He left his family so fast that we did not have time to bid him good bye. God loved him best so he called him home to rest.
