For many years, he attended a special needs daycare, where he enjoyed going on daily trips to the park, museums and other interesting places. Man had so much love and caring in him. He loved music (especially the oldies), watching TV, the outdoors and he loved to eat. He loved to give hugs, play with you and had an affectionate smile as he reached out to you. A flashlight was one of his favorite toys. Man could always tell when something was bothering his mother. We could see that her sadness made him sad. Although Man was not able to communicate verbally, he was able to express to you what he wanted and when he wanted it. We know that Man endured hardships throughout his life that we could not imagine enduring ourselves. We know now that he is enjoying in the heavens above, all the blessings of the Lord.
