REV. OSBURY CROCKETT JR., the cherished son of the late Osbury Crockett Sr. and Jocelyn Alston, entered this world in Baltimore, Maryland, on August 12, 1956. His earthly journey concluded on December 1, 2024 at his residence, surrounded by his dearest ones. Known affectionately as "Os," he acquired his education through the Baltimore City Public School System, completed his studies, and dedicated two years to the National Army. Embracing the role of a merchant seaman, which brought him joy through the opportunity to explore the world, he received an honorable discharge. Transitioning to work as a correctional officer at The Maryland State Penitentiary, he encountered his soulmate, Karen D. Dower, whom he patiently awaited as the love of his life, knowing she was "The One." His daughter Kenya Crockett now had a little sister, Cherice Crockett through their union. Following a 15-year tenure as a C.O., Os retired and ventured in entrepreneurship, establishing "Rapid Carpet Cleaning," imparting his business to his family.

An avid martial arts instructor, music enthusiast, bowler, connoisseur of good food, Western film aficionado, and an individual who cherished family time above all else, Os, fondly known as "Pop Pop" by his grandsons Daniel & David, will be dearly remembered for the times he and David made aluminum foil dinosaurs and David or Daniel's prompt attentiveness to his requests for juice or water.

A man of fervent faith, Os held a deep connection to his spirituality, welcoming the Lord into his life under the guidance of the apostle at Mt. Zion Baptist Church, and later receiving ordination at Greater St. John Full Gospel Church under the leadership of Rev. Robert McCoy. In his final days, he found solace within The Tree of Life Baptist Church under Pastor Sharon McLean's tutelage, actively engaging in online Bible Study sessions and Scripture discussions with fellow congregants. Despite physical limitations hindering his physical presence at services, he partook in monthly Holy Communion rituals with the unwavering support of his wife. The rare occasion that allowed him the strength to attend a church service became a cherished memory for all.

Survived by his devoted wife, Karen D.
