Oscar Webb, better known as Unc, son of the late Peter and Mendozia Webb was born July 30, 1922 in Valentine VA. where he was educated. After a long bout with cancer, kidney failure and diabetes he departed his life on December 1, 2002. At age 19, he came to Baltimore, Maryland, where he lived a short time before being inducted into the United States Army where he served during WWII and traveled the world for 2 years before being honorably discharged in December of 1945. He resided in Baltimore, soon after he met and married the former Elizabeth Harris. Unc worked many years with Potts and Calahan, where he worked his way from laborer to foreman and retired at age 65. Unc made numerous friends wherever he went and will be missed by everyone who knew him. He was always a true friend and devoted man to both family and the neighborhood. Unc leaves to cherish his memories: one sister, Bertha Woodridge, two brother-in-laws, Cleveland Woodridge of Philadelphia, and Wilbur Tucker of Gasburg, VA. three sister-in-law, Mary F. Hawkins and Minnie Webb both of Baltimore, Md. And Willie Mae Washington of Detroit, Michigan. His wife of 39 years Elizabeth; son, Tony; sisters, Maggie, Blanche and Irene; brothers, Isaac and Hose preceded him in death.
