Ozelia received her education at Brooks High School in Calvert County, Maryland. Upon completion of high school she worked as a nurse’s assistant. In 1949 she married James C. Price Jr. and out of this union they raised seven children. Ozelia’s most important job was as the caregiver for her children. She sacrificed every thing for the children in her family and neighborhood. She fostered many children over the course of her life. She volunteered for the Baltimore Public School System and as a foster grandparent for the department of Juvenile Justice. She was an active member of Central Summerfield United Methodist Church, which later became Wildwood Parkway United Methodist Church, from 1968 till her illness. Ozelia is survived by three daughters; Zelda Harvey, Rozelia Bradby, and Tracy Price; two sons, Kenneth Price and Earl Price; one son-in-law, Rodney Bradby; one daughter-in-law, Maxine Price; one brother-in-law, John Graham; two sister-in-laws, Mary Smith and Louise McCullough; nineteen grandchildren; ten great-grandchildren; two great-great-grandchildren; one sister, Rozelia Graham; one brother, Abraham Moore; and a host of nephews, nieces, friends, and neighbors.
