Later she was employed at New York Life for a number of years. Pam was quiet and unassuming with heart of gold and who would gladly do anything for her family and her friends, never expecting anything return.

Always so full of life, she had an eye for colors and patterns, translating this love for vibrant colors and crafting into something beautiful. She would use her artistic and creative skills to bring joy to the kids in the community, donating her time to balloon sculpting, face painting and reenactment of cartoon characters at birthday parties and children's celebrations. Pam never wanted to throw away anything .She recycled long before it had become the popular thing to do. She could take something that seemed worthless and transform it into spectacular. Pam's Creations include included beautiful, handcrafted greeting cards, assorted party favors, bracelets, necklaces and other fine jewelry piecing and arts and crafts, Her philosophy was 'always let your mistakes work for you'.

Though she had no biological children, she was unquestionably the world's greatest aunt. Aunt Pam would spent countless hours with nieces and

nephews, loving them, caring for them, encouraging them on to great things, allowing them their freedom of creative expression, creating intricate hair braid designs and haircuts and sometimes just listening to whatever was of interest to their little minds. They all loved their Aunt Pam, and they were there with her throughout her illness. This time it was their turn to shower her with love and attention, love messages and hand drawn artwork created just for her.

Pamela loved her family proved this time and again. All who knew can say there was never any sacrifice too great for her family And her family loved her cared for her even as her health began to fail. How does one explain the sisterly connection that causes the hospital room to suddenly light up when sister and sister-friend walk in? Or what can be said of a mother's love that keeps you going and doing and caring and praying when it seems you can go no further?

Pam held a deep and unwavering faith in God which sustained her through the most difficult of circumstances. She accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at an early age and was most recently a member of Miracle Tabernacle of God under the leadership of Pastor Brenda Brown. Her Christian upbringing in a God -Fearing home would serve her well throughout her life. Diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia in February 2015, throughout the next 20 months in MICU, months of rehabilitation, countless trips to the infusion center, and all of the ensuring 10 additional stays in the hospital. When health permitted, she would attend the worship services at the rehab center. Pamela was a true inspiration to so many other cancer patients, always positive, always upbeat, keeping up her appearance from the fashionable caps looked so good. People simply loved her and loved being around her, with the staff at University Medical often checking in on her just to say hello. Thank you, Elizabeth, Thank you. Aurora. Thank you, Ellen and so many others.

On Monday evening, October 17, 2016 with family at her bedside singing and praising God, our beloved Pamela peacefully made the transition from earth to glory, Though it may appear she lost the battle to cancer on this side, she really has won the most important battle of all. She fought a good fight. She leaves to cherish her memories her parents Thomas & Loretta Brown 3 sisters– Tamara Rush (Andre); Angela Brown, and Cassandra Brown; 3 aunts – Dorothy Waters, Linda Rascoe (Pastor David L. Rascoe) and Pastor Brenda Brown; 3 uncles; Raymond Brown (Geraldine), Halcon Brown (April), and Frank Finch (Mona); a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends, and childhood sister-friend, Onassis Kent.
