



Pastor Charles H. Wilson

December 29, 1929 - March 11, 2002

Reverend Charles Henry Wilson Sr., affectionately known as “Pepe” was the son of the late Richard and Isabelle Wilson. “Pepe” was born on December 29, 1929 in Howard County. He departed this life to be with the Lord on March 11, 2002 after a short illness. Reverend Wilson received his formal education in the Howard County Public Schools and was an employee for the Howard County Government for 23 years. Reverend Wilson received his spiritual ‘roots’ at Elkridge Methodist Church. He was under the Pastorate of the late Reverend John H. Blackstone. “Pepe” along with his brothers were known around the community as the “Wilson Boys”. With the help of their brother-in-law Bobby Kelly, the “Wilson Boys” laid the foundation and erected the basement of the original Elkridge Church. Upon the completion of this project, Reverend Blackstone established ‘Wilson Day’ in their honor for their hard work and continued financial support. “Pepe” always referred to Elkridge Community Church as his home. In 1954 Charles gave his life completely to the Lore. Two years later he was called by God to preach the gospel. He served under Reverend Roland Howard and the A.M.E. organization for three years. In September 1979, Reverend Charles started the Holy Bible Church in Ellicott City, Maryland. Under his Pastoral care others branched out and started their own ministries. He faithfully served the community and those in need over the years. He retired from Pastoral Ministry in 2000 but never retired from his service to the Lord. Reverend Charles Wilson, Sr., was a loving husband and father. He leaves to cherish his memory a loving wife,
