



## Pastor Haywood Robinson

April 6, 1927 - August 16, 2004

Reverend Haywood Robinson, Jr., departed this life on Monday, August 16, 2004, at his home. He was born to the late Haywood Robinson and Lucille Glover Robinson on April 6, 1927. He was also preceded in death by five siblings: brother, Rennie, and sisters, Ruth, Beatrice, Helen and Alberta. Rev. Robinson, a native of Lynchburg and former Marine, is a product of its public school system and received his college education at Hampton Institute (University) and his Theological training at Virginia Seminary (Virginia University at Lynchburg) with further study at Oberlin Divinity School. He is the recipient of the honorary Doctor of Divinity from both Virginia Seminary and Lynchburg College. He pastored churches in Bedford, VA; Washington, PA and his hometown of Lynchburg. He served for 32 years as Executive Director of Lynchburg Community Action Group (Lyn CAG) an anti-poverty program for Lynchburg and four surrounding counties. His community involvement has included: former Chairman of the Lynchburg School Board, former President of the Lynchburg Branch of the N.A.A.C.P., Lynchburg Ministerial Association, and Vice-Chairman of the Centra Health Board of Directors. He served on the Lynchburg Advisory Board of Sun Trust Bank, The Legacy Museum, and Board of Director of Amazement Square Children's Museum. Board of Directors of the Academy of Music, former President of the Lynchburg Covenant Fellowship, Inc., and president of the Lynchburg City Schools Education Foundation. He was Pastor Emeritus of the Diamond Hill Baptist Church which he retired after 36 years. Rev. Robinson leaves to celebrate his

life, his devoted wife, Alice E. Stokes Robinson; six children, Sylvina Jones, William Robinson, Marnetta Robinson, Delorese Ferguson (Phillip), Haywood A. Robinson (Renee), and Joanne Davis; his three sisters, Grace Robinson, Doris Daily, and Carolyn Bradshaw; three brothers-in-law, Paul Bradley, David Bradley (Christine) and William Copeland (Jean); and sister-in-law, Dorothy Rue (Sylvester). He also leaves to cherish his memory eleven grandchildren, nine great grandchildren and a host of nieces and nephews.
